Serious and challenging issues will be explored as well as some of the indivduals and groups making positive contributions toward a better future. Students will conduct research in areas of personal interest and make three presentations.							
達成目標	With the aim of students becoming autonomous learners, emphasis will be placed on the development of presentation skills. Students will learn to conduct research, critically analyze information, logically formulate a reasoned point of view, and gain skills in clear expression.							
到達目標	By the end of this course, students should be able to make effective plans for independent learning; individually conduct research; separate facts from opinions; discuss the topic with others; write an essay including facts and a personal point of view; create and deliver a five to seven-minute PowerPoint presentation that includes an effective story message, visual message, and physical message. By making three presentations, students will build the confidence to speak-out in public forums.
